Focus on the whole child and reflect the holistic way in which children learn

Whanau tangata Family & community

Include families and whānau

Ng*a* hohonga Relationships

Recognise the people, places and things that support children's learning

Purpose



Enhancing learning and development by giving feedback

- Enhancing relationships with families and whānau
- Identifying children who need additional support

Focus



Children's developing knowledge, skills, attitudes and dispositions as related to Te Whāriki's strands and learning outcomes.



Positive learning dispositions e.g courage, curiosity, trust, playfulness, perseverance, confidence and responsibility.



Dispositional behaviours for learning e.g. taking an interest, being involved, persisting, taking risks, asking for help, expressing a point of view or sharing knowledge.



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
